

A MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

E ach year, millions of people are impacted by domestic violence, affecting the survivor's emotions, sense of safety, relationships, health, housing, and economic stability. Domestic violence can happen to anyone, and is caused by one person using a multitude of tactics to establish and maintain power and control over their partner. This pervasive act of violence can have a direct impact on the survivor's family and friends as well as the community.

Several misconceptions about domestic violence still exist in our society resulting in survivor's being responded to with negative, victimblaming statements and questions. At Turning Point, we believe that education impacts social change and prevents violence. Our community education team partners with local churches, professionals, groups, coalitions, and agencies, providing education for approximately 3500 adults annually. Community education presentations focus on actions we can all take to support survivors while holding offenders accountable for their actions. This educated, coordinated community response to domestic violence contributes to creating conditions that promote healthy relationships, preventing domestic violence.

According to loveisrespect.org violent behaviors often begin between age 12-18. This frightening statistic highlights the need for early, prevention education. Turning Point offers ageappropriate, interactive presentations to middle and high school students to educate on dynamics of healthy relationships, ways to support survivors, and available resources. The prevention education program also includes a parent program, where parents can learn more about domestic violence and how to talk to their children about relationships.

about Turning Point's Survivor Speaker's Bureau. I grew up thinking if a guy likes you, it is possible that you'll be subject to some form of abuse. Before I knew statistically Teen Dating Violence was common, I'd observed and experienced it myself. As early as age 15 I encountered physical, sexual, verbal, and emotional abuse. Watching little to nothing be done about it from peers or adults. I knew it was wrong. But the lack of safe spaces or resources caused me to suppress my true feelings daily in high school. It wasn't until I wanted to harm myself that I knew I needed to get from behind the shadows of my sorrow and step into my light. With that, I found the courage

to self-publish my first memoir which helped me through the shadows of my sorrow and gave me purpose.

When we think of Domestic Violence, rarely do we think of teenagers; however Teen Dating Violence is just as serious as violence amongst adults. Minimizing these experiences amongst adolescents creates long term negative effects, such as intergenerational trauma. It also teaches teens that abuse is acceptable and normal in relationships.

Writing and sharing my story with others has helped me in my healing journey. Not only did Turning Point give me a platform to continue sharing my story, but they also helped me identify signs of abuse and what a healthy relationship looks like. The more awareness brought to the issue of Teen Dating Violence, the more we can work together to prevent it. I hope that as I continue healing in sharing my story, it will also inspire courage and healing in others.


