A MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

Forty-five years ago, a small group of caring neighbors in Macomb County came together to address a growing crisis.

It was the late 1970s, a time characterized by a significant increase in domestic and sexual violence. Families, especially women and children, had nowhere to turn for help. Community members like Vivastine Seward stepped up to take action. In the kitchen of Greater Morning Star Baptist Church, Vivastine began preparing meals and gathering clothing for survivors. Soon after, with her influence, the rectory of Greater Grace Episcopal Church became the first safe shelter in Macomb County.

This initiative sparked the beginning of Turning Point. Built and sustained by the community, it has operated for 45 years on the belief that when we come together, we can make a significant difference.

However, just as we came together 45 years ago, we must come together now. The need for Turning Point's services has never been greater. Yet, the funding that sustains these life-saving programs is at risk. The federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA), one of our

largest funding sources, has been in decline for years and is projected to drop another 15-20% starting this October. This means fewer resources to keep our shelter beds open, our 24-hour hotline staffed, and to ensure that first-response advocates are available when survivors need them most.

This is a moment for our community to act. Just as individuals united in the beginning to meet an urgent need, we are once again called to rise to the challenge. Your support today can help ensure that survivors continue to find safety, hope, and healing at Turning Point, no matter what the circumstances.

Everyone has the power to make a difference. Today, Turning Point is Macomb County's only comprehensive agency supporting survivors of domestic violence, sexual violence, and human trafficking. Together, we have made an incredible impact:

- Our 24-Hour Hotline answers an average of 10,000 per year, providing a lifeline for individuals in crisis and partners within the community.
- Annually, over 200 families fleeing abuse and violence have found safety through our shelter.
- We complete an average of 400 medical forensic exams each year, ensuring survivors receive traumainformed healthcare.

These statistics represent lives changed. Thanks to people like you, we have empowered survivors with the support and resources they need to rebuild their lives and keep their families safe.

"Growing up in Mt. Clemens, I saw my grandmother nearly every day. My grandmother, Vivastine Seward, was a loving woman known for her infectious

laughter, radiant smile, love for Christ and her family, and her unwavering commitment to helping others. To me, she was "Granny Stine"—the one whose cooking could heal any hurt and whose coconut cakes were unmatched. Little did I know, she was also a founder and a visionary. In 1980, she helped establish Turning Point LLC, a sanctuary for survivors of domestic violence. I remember stopping by Turning Point

and witnessing the impact of her volunteerism firsthand, often alongside my other grandmother, Bobbie Douglas. Families found hope there and healing. Her compassion extended far beyond our family—it shaped our entire community. Even now, friends speak of her with deep admiration, sharing how she helped their loved ones through incredibly tough times. Her legacy lives on in the organization she built, the lives she touched, and the love she gave so freely. As I walk in her footsteps, I carry her stories, recipes, love for philanthropy, and mission. Every time I speak her name, I honor the turning point she created—for the world and for me."
